This upgrade ensures that students and faculty in the psychology department have access to reliable and efficient computing resources.
- 3. WiFi Router Deployment: To bolster connectivity across various departments and the IQAC, the institution acquired five D-Link AC1200 WiFi Gigabit Routers. These routers contribute to a robust and high-speed network infrastructure, facilitating seamless communication and data access.
- 4. Diversified Internet Connections: The institution secured internet services from Kerala Vision Broadband Ltd. with a bandwidth of 300 Mbps, ensuring high-speed connectivity for various online activities. Additionally, a connection with a bandwidth of 100 Mbps from BSNL was established, along with a leased line broadband connection featuring a bandwidth of 20 Mbps. These multiple internet connections aim to provide redundancy and ensure uninterrupted online access for academic and administrative needs.

In solid waste management, the college segregates bio-degradable, plastic, and recyclable waste using identifiable colored bins throughout classrooms and corridors. Daily waste collection undergoes systematic processing, aided by a Memorandum of

Understanding with Haritha KarmaSena and private agencies for non-degradable waste disposal. Incinerator facilities in ladies' toilets enhance hygiene, while biodegradable kitchen waste is directed to a biogas plant, generating daily cooking fuel for the canteen.

Liquid waste, comprising greywater, is processed in Sewage Treatment Plants (STPs), with the treated water utilized for gardening, including vegetable and herbal gardens, as well as construction and miscellaneous purposes. The college takes a proactive approach to reducing E-waste, conducting minor and major repairs and collaborating with authorized agencies for responsible disposal. Biomedical waste is effectively managed, and hazardous chemicals undergo safe collection and disposal following scientific procedures, ensuring the overall environmental sustainability of the institution.

RAM, 500GB HDD, and 128GB SSD. This upgrade ensures that students and faculty in the psychology department have access to reliable and efficient computing resources.

- 3. WiFi Router Deployment: To bolster connectivity across various departments and the IQAC, the institution acquired five D-Link AC1200 WiFi Gigabit Routers. These routers contribute to a robust and high-speed network infrastructure, facilitating seamless communication and data access.
- 4. Diversified Internet Connections: The institution secured internet services from Kerala Vision Broadband Ltd. with a bandwidth of 300 Mbps, ensuring high-speed connectivity for various online activities. Additionally, a connection with a bandwidth of 100 Mbps from BSNL was established, along with a leased line broadband connection featuring a bandwidth of 20 Mbps. These multiple internet connections aim to provide redundancy and ensure uninterrupted online access for academic and administrative needs.

The college is deeply committed to effective waste management, aligning itself with the Swachh Bharat Abhiyan and fostering a sustainable environment. Various student groups, such as NSS, Bhoomithrasena, and the Nature Club, actively participate in waste management initiatives. The institution prioritizes cleanliness and aesthetic appeal, implementing a well-designed

system for handling degradable and non-degradable waste.

In solid waste management, the college segregates biodegradable, plastic, and recyclable waste using identifiable colored bins throughout classrooms and corridors. Daily waste collection undergoes systematic processing, aided by a Memorandum of Understanding with Haritha KarmaSena and private agencies for non-degradable waste disposal. Incinerator facilities in ladies' toilets enhance hygiene, while biodegradable kitchen waste is directed to a biogas plant, generating daily cooking fuel for the canteen.

Liquid waste, comprising greywater, is processed in Sewage Treatment Plants (STPs), with the treated water utilized for gardening, including vegetable and herbal gardens, as well as construction and miscellaneous purposes. The college takes a proactive approach to reducing E-waste, conducting minor and major repairs and collaborating with authorized agencies for responsible disposal. Biomedical waste is effectively managed, and hazardous chemicals undergo safe collection and disposal following scientific procedures, ensuring the overall environmental sustainability of the institution.
