Flexible Graduation Programs: NEP 2020 introduces a flexible, cross-curricular 4-year graduation program, offering multiple exit options. Dr. Shamu emphasized the policy's aim to eliminate distinctions between curricular, co-curricular, and extra-curricular activities.



Method of Testing and Future Directions: The policy advocates for a criteriabased assessment focused on fixed learning outcomes. Dr. Shamu discussed the shift from testing as an end to a tool for self-assessment, reducing the reliance on coaching centers and alleviating stress.

Challenges and Incentives: Acknowledging challenges during institutional reconfiguration, Dr. Shamu advocated for a bottom-up approach. Institutions are granted the freedom to choose their focus, and incentives for teachers, including fast-tracked promotions and monetary rewards for research, were highlighted.



Special education zones, social-inclusion funds, and gender-inclusion funds were proposed to address imbalances in educational participation in remote areas.

Enculturalisation & Manmaking" in the context of contemporary educational practices.


Keynote Speech: Prof. T. Mohan Babu


Day Three

Conclusion


